CONSUMER ALERT TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC

SAFETY RECALL OF MORE THAN 5000 FORD VEHICLES BY FORD MOTOR COMPANY OF SOUTHERN AFRICA

- The COMESA Competition Commission (the "Commission") has become aware of a recall of Ford models Ranger, Everest, EcoSport and Puma in July 2025, by Ford Motor Company of Southern Africa ("Ford SA"). The voluntary recall follows safety concerns affecting the various models built between 2021-2025.
- 2. Below are details of the affected Ford models:

The Commission is aware that consumers from several COMESA Member States import similar vehicles from South Africa, and therefore, pursuant to Article 30(1)(b) of the COMESA Competition Regulations, the Commission wishes to inform the public of the risks associated with the recalled Ford vehicles and advises affected consumers to verify whether their vehicles are affected and have them checked and repaired.
- 6. The Commission in collaboration with national consumer agencies, shall assist consumers from any COMESA Member State who may be affected with this recall upon evidence that the consumer's vehicle is of the make and model, and was built in the period mentioned in the voluntary recall.
